Essential Functions and Technical Standards for Nurse Aide Students

Purpose Statement: The following standards reflect reasonable expectations of a student in the Nurse Aide (NA) Program for the performance of common nurse aide functions. In adopting these standards the NA Program is mindful of the patient's right to safe and quality health care by students. The NA student must be able to apply the knowledge and skills necessary to function in a broad variety of clinical situations while providing the spectrum of nurse aide interventions. These standards do reflect what may be required for employment of the graduate NA. To verify the students' ability to perform these essential functions, students **will be required to demonstrate** the following technical standards:
